My youngest child Asher can feed himself. He can pick up a spoon or fork, grab some food with it, and shovel it into his cute little mouth. Another thing he can do now is go to the potty by himself. Sure, he needs a little help when, well you know, but he lets us know when it's time to use the restroom and gets on that toilet all by himself. I can remember how just a few years ago the little guy just sat there and cried when he was hungry, not knowing how to get food into that little mouth of his. I remember how less than a year ago, he was still wearing diapers, and we were enjoying all the fun that goes along with that.

It wasn't overnight that he learned. It took us helping him to hold the spoon, coaching him on how to pick up the food and bring it to his mouth, and learning how to eat over his plate (still working on that one). It took potty parties, many accidents, putting him on the toilet, and showing him how to go like a big boy. It took days, weeks, months, and years of repetition to train him how to do these activities we all do without thinking as adults.

When I was about 25 years old, I visited my aunt and uncle and thanked them for all the effort they put into raising me. Even though I lived with them from when I was about 13 until I was 18, and a few times after that, I never quite understood (and still don't completely) the amount of time, effort, sacrifice, patience, long-suffering, humility, and every other precious word that describes the love that they invested into me. They took in a 13 year old that was in many ways living without boundaries and rules. Not only that, but a young man that was permitted and encouraged by some parental figures to indulge in the pleasures of the flesh. I was unrestrained coming into an environment of rules, principles, and appropriate conduct. I can only imagine how exhausted they must have felt as they consistently put a standard in front of me only to be dismissed, fought against, lied to, and rebelled against so many times.

As a youth minister and father of two teenagers I am getting a small dose of what they encountered when they took in that 13 year old boy. Working with and raising teens that have the physical capacity and ability to choose what is pure, right, and holy, but so often step in the wrong direction due to their ignorance, inexperience, and misconceptions is challenging. We teach them only to see them stumble once again in the wrong direction. It sometimes feels like I am hitting my head against the wall. I am sure all those that have or are raising children can empathize.

A came across a quote recently by a Family Therapist and Parenting Coach, Jennifer Kolari. She made this encouraging statement, "What I always say to parents is that you're not a parent, you're a substitute frontal lobe, that's what you are. And guess what your job is? Inhibit, organize, prioritize, and motivate, that's what you're doing. And that's why when parents say to me why do I have to say the same thing fifty thousand times? Because that's the brain function you are providing."

This reality reflects the importance of obeying the timeless and inspired teachings of Moses, that we should teach God's commandments consistently, wherever we are, and with perseverance (Deuteronomy 6:7-9). He might as well have said "staple the rules to their foreheads!" or "say the same thing fifty thousand times!". It reflects the words of our Lord when He taught us to consistently teach all the commandments of Jesus as we live our lives, day to day, and moment to moment (Matthew 28:18-20). I don't know how long it will take for our teenagers to have their frontal lobes transformed, but the charge is that we persevere until they do.

Maturation takes time. Raising the next generation can be exhausting, but we do it with the hope that the time and effort we pour into these souls will not come back void. So I want to encourage everyone that is working to build up this next generation of precious souls, to keep at it, because you might just get that 23 year old returning back to you thanking you for the time you invested into them.
