

# **Broken Arrow Church of Christ**

As far as I am aware, there are no English translations of the Bible that include the nouns "priority or priorities" or the verb "prioritize." That may seem somewhat surprising, given the fact that we regularly utilize Scripture for the purpose of keeping our thinking, our actions, and our faith properly oriented and ordered according to the will and the word of God. However, even though these specific words don't appear in our English Bibles, the concept of prioritization is abundantly apparent throughout Scripture.

Rather than fretfully and anxiously stressing over our basic physical needs, Jesus taught us to "seek first God's kingdom and his righteousness," trusting that our loving, generous Father will supply all of our needs (Matt. 6:33). When asked about the "highest priority commandment," Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments," (Matt. 22:34-40; Deut. 6:5; Lev. 19:18).

The apostle Paul wrote that we are to "honor others above ourselves" (Rom. 12:10) and "value others above ourselves" (Phil. 2:3). Such attitudes and actions toward others indicate our priorities. As the children's song states so simply, "J.O.Y., J.O.Y., this is what it means. Jesus first, yourself last, and others in between."

I was taught a lasting lesson about priorities long before I ever used the word in a sentence. It was 47  $\frac{1}{2}$  years ago in the fall of 1976. Lawrence Bailey, a teacher and coach at Clark-Moores Middle School in Richmond, Kentucky, was addressing our newly formed basketball squad. Just making the team had been a challenge. Seven elementary schools fed into Clark-Moores, which was solely dedicated to  $8^{th}$  Grade due to the number of students in the district. Tryouts had lasted a couple of weeks since nearly 100 young men were vying for one of the 15 spots on the team

Coach Bailey told us in no uncertain terms that the most important thing in his life was his relationship with God. Profanity would not be tolerated in games, practices, or the locker room. After his faith in Jesus Christ came his relationship with his wife. I honestly can't remember if they had children, but his family came after his faith. Third in the pecking order was his concern for our academic success, how we fared in the classroom, and the seriousness with which we took our education. Then, and only then, was he concerned with our conditioning, the development of our basketball skills, and how we performed on the court. After nearly 50 years, I am still influenced by and deeply appreciative of Coach Bailey's convictions and commitment as a Christian, a coach, and a teacher.

After my sabbatical and silent retreat in Kentucky two years ago, I met up with Terry Day, a classmate and teammate from Daniel Boone Elementary and Clark-Moores Middle School. Among the many things we covered in catching up on 45 years of life, I shared with Terry the lasting impression that Coach Bailey had made on me and that I had emailed him several years ago to thank him. I received a text message from Terry in January of this year stating that he had seen Coach Bailey that day at a funeral. Terry shared my comments with Coach Bailey, and Coach mentioned the email that I had sent him. The coolest (and totally unsurprising) thing that Terry shared in our text exchange was how long it took him to get to talk with Coach Bailey after the service. He was completely surrounded by former students and athletes whom he had guided and influenced during his 30 years at Clark-Moores as a teacher, coach, assistant principal, and principal.

Let us boldly proclaim and confidently live out our priorities each day. Others will see. Others will know. Others will remember. Even 50 years from now.
