CONSIDER CAREFULLY HOW YOU LISTEN

Suppose Jesus came in person and spoke to your Bible class, Life Group, or at one of our worship services. Would you daydream through His talk, fall asleep, whisper to your friends, or tell your spouse a funny story that just popped into your head? I don't think so. You would probably be awestruck and taking in every word, down to the last syllable, that Jesus spoke. But have you ever realized that since God is the author of the Bible, each of us has a tremendous responsibility each time we hear it read and explained?

How you hear the Word of God can determine whether you go to heaven or hell, whether you will follow Jesus or not. Does that sound overly dramatic to you? Hang in there and see where I'm coming from with this statement.

Inattentiveness to God's Word can ruin your life! The devil knows this and will try to make you think that goofing around during Bible class or worship (or keeping someone else from listening to a Bible lesson), is innocent fun. It isn't.

Really listening isn't easy; neither is concentrating when we read the Bible for ourselves. We can use some help. So, here is a suggestion. Confess any wrong attitudes you may have in this area and ask God to be with you as you draw courage from Him to change. Each time you come to a Bible class or worship service, don't think to yourself, "This is going to be easy. All I must do is sit and listen." Pray for God's help each time you are to listen to His Word.

Make up your mind to listen attentively every time you hear a scripture reading, a sermon, or a Bible lesson. Take notes—even if no one else does—to help you concentrate. When you study the Bible for yourself, decide to do your best to get everything possible out of it.

The Word of God contains truths that will give you an abundant and joyful life—if you hear them, understand them, and apply them! And truth be told, it is super difficult to apply them if I let my mind meander its way through my study time.

In Luke 8, Jesus will make a point using an illustration. "¹⁶ No one lights a lamp and hides it in a clay jar or puts it under a bed. Instead, they put it on a stand, so that those who come in can see the light." Jesus then goes on to further explain by saying, "¹⁷ For there is nothing hidden that will not be disclosed, and nothing concealed that will not be known or brought out into the open."

And then... And then... Jesus drives home the point I'm also making here. "¹⁸ Therefore, consider carefully how you listen."

Use your mind to understand that the Bible really is God's Words to us. The Creator of the universe inspired the words. They are His words. And they are meant for us. How exciting!
