LISTEN TO HIM ANDREW LEMUS MAY 21, 2023

When Jesus stood up to preach to the crowds on the mountain He was talking to an audience much like ours. A people who had the law, preachers who studied and proclaimed it, and a group that believed they were kingdom citizens. He stood up to speak to God's chosen people. What He said next must have humbled, angered, and upset the ears that yielded to His voice.

"For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:20

Like John before Him, Jesus was striving to bring souls under the reign of God and one of the largest hindrances to their obedience was their own self right-eousness. They were taught a shell of the law from their religious leaders that left them, and those that they followed, confident in their relationship with God. Sadly, they were given and embraced only a measure of God's word, a measure that seemed to gravitate towards laws that were "easier" to keep. Laws like don't murder, don't commit adultery, don't be vengeful, and others (Matt. 5:21-48). If righteousness was based on their standard, how righteous we would all be!

The warning given by Jesus is as true today as it was in the first century. Even today some still espouse righteousness by adhering to a shell of the new law. Instead of teaching the full counsel of God they tickle the ears of their listeners, causing them to take on a false comfort in the righteousness their preacher lays out before them (2Tim. 4:3). Promoting a superficial faith instead of one that consumes hearts and minds. Jesus wants His citizens to follow, listen to, and obey Him, not men (Lk 9:35).

While Tim, Scott, myself, and others who proclaim God's word diligently work to rightly divide the word of God, the responsibility to follow God and His will rests on each of our own shoulders (2Tim. 2:15). We each will stand in front of

God and be judged by His word (Jn 12:48). So let's encourage each other to follow Jesus. Kingdom citizens are called to put their faith in Him, to love Him, and to obey Him. To forsake all others, including ourselves, to pick up our crosses, and follow Him. Like the first century Israelites, we have to make sure that we are not putting our hope in the precepts and principles of men, but in the will of God.


