

SCIENCE IS STILL LEARNING

In filmmaking and storytelling, there is a well-known element called a 'reveal.' It's when a piece of information is withheld from a viewer, allowing them to follow a natural set of assumptions that actually isn't accurate.

This has been accomplished in Earth Science by putting forth two lines of thinking that everyone has been taught since a young age. These two areas relate geologic processes and radioisotope dating. The scientific community (and maybe most of the population of the USA) puts enormous trust in these two lines of thought and we have been taught to believe them as truth. The geologic process is established through the "conventional" explanation of the Grand Canyon which almost everyone is familiar with; radioisotope dating is established through school science textbooks, teachers, videos, and science shows.

And yet the one thing this "conventional view" rejects is the eyewitness account. According to this view of the world, no one was there to observe most of the events of natural history. This applies even to Christians who have accepted the "conventional view" of history, and therefore must see Genesis 1 as being allegorical (not factual) and Genesis 6-8 as a local flood (not a global flood).

However, there are different ways of looking at what we see around us. Consider the amazing things that have been learned from the Mount Saint Helens eruption on May 18, 1980 and we may figure out that what we have been taught as "conventional" truth concerning earth's geology may not be accurate at all.

Dr. Steve Austin (geologist) calls Mount St. Helens "the Rosetta stone" of catastrophic geology. Mount St. Helens links up eyewitness accounts of a major volcanic eruption and the decades long aftermath with the observation of forensic data. What this demonstrates is it doesn't take nearly as long to create certain geological structures as had been previously assumed. Steve mentions four things learned from Mount St. Helens:

1. Rapid Sedimentation – It is strange to realize that you are walking on a part of the earth that simply didn't exist when you were born. We all have this assumption of stability and age when we look at landscapes in the world (even if we think the earth is only thousands of years old). And yet as you hike into the canyon area, you are reminded that the canyon is new. At the bottom of the canyon, you can see the many different layers, including the thin laminations and the flat boundaries. It is obvious that a lot has happened in a very short period of time.

2. Rapid Erosion – Again, we often don't think of the various events necessary to arrive at a current landscape. In this case, when you stand at the bottom of the canyon, next to the stream, you come to realize that the very place you are standing had once been covered with a forest. That exact place went from forest, to mud, to creek bed before our very eyes. The fact that this last step happened quickly through erosion which had been observed was remarkable.

3. Rapid Recovery – The next thing Steve points out was how many plants were growing in the area. He explained that in the years immediately after the eruption, animals also quickly returned to the area. This was because God created the natural world to be able to automatically fix itself and recover from catastrophes. It gave a new appreciation of how the world could have recovered relatively quickly from something even as massive as a global flood with all the volcanism that would have gone along with it.

4. Incredible Complexity – The last thing Steve points out is how complex and interrelated all the different events were that occurred, many of which were wiped out or changed by events that came after them. This demonstrates that geological processes are far from simple and straightforward, but that there is an incredibly interlocking complexity that is best unraveled by knowing the actual history of the events.

So here is what the findings at Mount St. Helens does for each of us. It lets us experience a small paradigm shift. Mount St. Helens shows us, an eyewitness account can transform how one views the actual evidence. MAY 19, 2024
